

Red Lion / Crab House –

Is scheduled to start any time, they moved up the timing on painting. We worked with corporate offices to review options colors.

Harbor Mall –

Locally owned, originally built in 1929 as the Olympic Motor Coach Terminal and Greyhound Bus Station in the Art Deco/Art Modern Style, and remodeled in the 1980's. The entire building was painted in a pale yellow, so you could not see the details. The building was adopted by Olympic Medical Center and Peninsula College. The Coast Guard also came in and cleared the vacant lot to the south and painted the south end of the building. Liquid Painting donated spraying the west side of the building.

Dairy Queen –

We are working with the owner and corporate office on painting this building.

Currency Exchange –

This little building was originally gray and white and could not be seen. The owner worked with us on picking the red paint and he painted it himself.

Old Boardwalk Café –

This building is one of the City owned buildings and they had it painted by a painting company and worked with us on picking the colors.

Necessities & Temptations –

This business owner had the awnings cleaned and repainted and brighten up the entryways and window trim.

Budget CD's & Tapes –

Built in 1923 as the Marshal Wells Store, this building has been remodeled over the years. We have been working with the building owner and the business owner on new paint colors. We are getting the building owners final approval and will soon be paint the front façade.

Downtown Hotel and Corner House –

Locally family owned building, originally built in 1896 as the Hotel Pershing. Was the first all concrete building in town. This was the first building to be painted in this program. The owners brought a photograph of another building the colors they liked and we worked with them on fine tuning the colors.

Budget Garage –

This is another City owned building they had painted. This was originally built in 1927 as the Larry Winters Storage Garage in the Spanish Colonial Revival style. We worked with the City on getting colors to fit the style of the building.

Wenger Building –

Original building was built in 1915 and was later add onto in 1926. We worked with the family on getting new colors picked and got Windermere real estate to adopt the building. They have over 200 man hours in painting.

Delaney's –

Built in 1927 as the Angeles Realty Company Building. We are in the process of repainting the wood and brick infill to tie in with the existing brick façade and accent the metal cornice with new paint.

Blue Dolphin –

Locally owned, originally built in 1931 as the Elwa Theater Building. Owners had picked colors and started to paint, but did not like the colors once on the

building. We worked with them to pick new colors and are now getting them on the building.

Bank of America Building –

Originally built in 1922 as the First National Bank Building, this building had the third floor removed 1980's because the building was sinking under the weight. This building is on the list to be painted and we are working on getting new colors for them to review.

Rick's Place –

Originally built in 1921 and was known as the Harrington-Giles building. The owners are looking at removing the metal work on the upper floor exposing the windows and repainting.

Christian Science –

Family owned building, built in 1914 as the Kuppler Building. This building is owned by the same family as the Harrington-Giles building and they are looking at just repainting.

Family Shoe Building –

Built in 1890 this is the oldest building we have in the downtown. The owner is looking at touching up the goose on the side and as rumor has it also looking at restoring the upper floor windows in the front. At one time a brothel was run out of the upper floor.

Water West-

At one time this was the City Hall building, and was sold by the City. We are looking at repairing the stucco and repainting the building. I need to do a rendering for the owners to see the new colors and what it may look like.

Copies Plus –

Built in 1951 in the International Style, this was the old police station. The owner has suggested a black and white color scheme, but was open to more suggestions. Working on the black the owner suggested the warm gray color pallet with a touch of bright red accents; this would work with the original architectural style of the building.

Oak Street Building –

This building originally housed the post office before it moved to the Federal Building. The owners wanted to have the colors pop more, but need to work with the existing awing colors.

Baster's Auto Parts –

The owner is removing the windows on the east side of the building at this time and once completed will be repainting. There has been talk about murals on the east side and on the alley.

Stepping Out –

The owners repainted brighter colors.

Alley Cat/Weisfield –

The building owner repainted the front of the building the existing colors, but painted the side of the building to coordinate with the neighboring building. At the rear of the building the owner wanted to have a mural painted and the people at the Waterfront Gallery donated their time and talent for what is now on the back.

Cottage Queen/Chique Antiques –

Locally owned, was built in 1929 as the City Public Market. This building is scheduled to start work shortly, and will have the back painted with some bright accent colors and the front cleaned and touched paint.

E-Z pawn Shop –

Locally owned, was built in 1928 as the Montgomery Ward Building. It has been painted on all four sides.

Lee Plaza –

The original building was built in 1927 in the Tudor Revival style, and the addition was built in 1930 in the Art Deco/Art Modern style. The Housing Authority of Clallam County remodeled the building in the early 1990's and is now housing. The street level façade is getting touched up with new paint colors to tie into the existing brick and tile work on the building.

Far Horizon –

We are working with the owner on getting new paint colors.

The Morris Building –

Locally owned, this building was built as a bank and office building. The owners repainted in the same colors and added more red accents. This was planned as the regular building maintenance.

The Toggery/First St. Haven –

Locally owned, built in 1922 as the Aldwell Addition Building. The owner repainted the front façade and windows. This owner worked last summer with the IBC Youth Group and repainted the rear of the building.

Kaufman-Miller –

Built in 1926 as the Kaufman Leonard Furniture Building. The owner has just moved back to town and we are working with him on what he wants to do with the building.

Elks –

Built 1926 as the Naval Lodge Elks Building in the Spanish Colonial Revival style. The awing was removed by the members of The Elks, and the façade will be repaired and repainted.

Dynasty –

The business owners are looking at repainting.

Bella Italia –

The owner had already scheduled to remove the old awing and do some building repairs and add the new canvas awing on the building now.

There has been a number of buildings on the corridor coming in and out of downtown that have or will be repainting.
