OLD BUSINESS:

1. Marking Parking Spaces in Zak's Lot (Nathan)
Nathan is finalizing with DSHS and all lots will be done at the same time in next week or two.
2. Parking Permits for Residential Use
Four permits will be issued monthly with a red letter "R" to signify residential parking. The permits will sell for \$25/mo or \$300/annually. Those using the permit can park in permitted spots only. Nathan indicated that the City did not feel that a change in enforcement hours was necessary at this time.
3. Cherry St. at the alley turn resolution
No discussion—tabled to September meeting
4. Schedule time for remarking lots
Scheduling will occur as soon as Nathan confirms permit markings.
5. Special Permit for Customer Classes
For businesses wanting to offer half-day or full day classes in conjunction with their business, a special "Day Class Permit" will be available through the PADA office at a cost of \$2.00 per permit with the specific class date on the mirror hanger.
6. Parking Permit procedures
Change for acquiring monthly parking permits. Multiple month parking permits can now be purchase at City Hall. By September 1, permits will be available for Sept., Oct., Nov. and Dec. with 2011 monthly permits available in January. The monthly permit fee remains at \$15.00. Annual permits will be available beginning in January, 2011 for \$165.00 for the entire year.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Parking lot signage for DSHS lot
(free customer parking on weekends)
No Discussion—tabled to Sept. meeting
2. Event Parking
The committee has added to its list of items for review a plan for handling event parking requests in the Downtown CBD. Consideration will be given to days of the week that the events occur, location of events and impact on customer parking for the daily course of business and how all needs can be met.
3. Late Item—Alley Use
The City ordinance currently states that parking for loading and unloading in alleys is limited to 15 minutes. Nathan has suggested that the committee and Board review that policy to determine if that is sufficient time or if it should be increased. Result of recent issues in the alley with regard to parking over 15 minutes and being ticketed.
4. Issues with businesses on So. Lincoln and in the alley on E. First with regard to recent events involving parking citations and manner of enforcement were discussed. The committee will continue to monitor the situation. As an enforcement issue, it should be referred to the Police Department and Chief Gallagher.
