Northwest to above the Arctic Circle in Canada and Alaska to the canyonlands of the American Southwest. His images include traditional landscape and wildlife photography as well as aerial work. Dave's first book publication came in 2008, as photographer of ***Totem Poles of the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe: The Art of Dale Faulstich***, published by the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe.

Tim McNulty is a poet, essayist and nature writer. His nine books of poetry include ***In Blue Mountains Dusk, Through High Still Air, Cloud Studies*** and ***Some Ducks***. He has written eleven books of natural history: including ***Olympic National Park: A Natural History***, which won a Governor's Writers Award and ***Washington's Mount Rainer National Park***, which won a National Outdoor Award. His works have been translated into German, Japanese and Chinese.
